THE HOLY WEEK, PRELUDE TO EASTER

16th March 2025

Lent commences with the Ash Wednesday celebrations, and for five weeks, Christians all over the world will perform acts of spiritual preparation and purification, reaching culmination in the Holy Week.

On Palm Sunday, the Sunday beginning of Holy Week, we celebrate the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem: many people lining up the streets and acclaiming him as a great and wonderful prophet - many believing that he is the long awaited Messiah, some even wanted him to be made king. And yet, we know that he came into the city riding on a humble donkey, the very image of a people's king coming in peace - as opposed to that image of a proud conqueror riding in on a war horse!

In the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, again, we get to be inspired by the humility of Jesus, who, though he is the Christ, showed his followers that he is there to serve and not to be served. We are in a state of suspense as to what comes next in the drama of salvation ...

On Good Friday, we cannot help but feel for the suffering Christ, who, though He is the Son of God, chose to accept the humiliation and the interminable punishment dealt on him by his tormentors – to show us that even in suffering, God is with us ... and that therefore, this experience of the human Jesus has to be, all for our sake and our salvation. We are sad and mortified ...

On the eve of Holy Saturday going into Easter Sunday, we commemorate and rejoice at the resurrection of Christ, his triumph over death and sin – restoring us to a righteous relationship with God. We celebrate that through this great act in his mission of salvation, Christ showed us that we too have a chance to eternal life, if we but keep faith. We are grateful.

In all these celebrations commemorating the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ – the very story of our salvation, the challenge is to focus more on the reason for and the meaning of the celebrations.

It is a common tendency to put lots of effort in the perfection of the execution of the rituals – for example: is that banner appropriate and timely? is the dripping of melted wax from the lit candles minimized? were the ringing of the bells timely? were the hymns sang to perfection? etc. And yet these are mostly trimmings, by the by. These celebrations are occasions of prayer, both individual and communal! It quite understandable that people need to be allowed to share their talents – and that in doing so, be also recognised for it but it must be kept in mind that these are community events, not individual performances. These celebrations are for the good of all; that, hopefully, we will grow together in faith and knowledge of God.

Therefore, this is the real challenge from the Spirit: to discern and be aware of God's presence in all things, even in hectic and seemingly overwhelmingly awesome activities.

SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT- YR C

First Reading Genesis 15:5-12,17-18

God enters into a Covenant with Abraham, the man of faith

Taking Abram outside, the Lord said, 'Look up to heaven and count the stars if you can.' 'Such will be your descendants,' he told him. Abram put his faith in the Lord, who counted this as making him justified.

'I am the Lord' he said to him 'who brought you out of Ur of the Chaldaeans to make you heir to this land.' 'My Lord,' Abram replied 'how am I to know that I shall inherit it?' He said to him, 'Get me a three-year-old heifer, a three-year-old goat, a three-year-old ram, a turtledove and a young pigeon.' He brought him all these, cut them in half and put half on one side and half facing it on the other; but the birds he did not cut in half. Birds of prey came down on the carcases but Abram drove them off.

Now as the sun was setting Abram fell into a deep sleep, and terror seized him. When the sun had set and darkness had fallen, there appeared a smoking furnace and a firebrand that went between the halves. That day the Lord made a Covenant with Abram in these terms:

'To your descendants I give this land,

from the wadi of Egypt to the Great River.'
